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roles, Dr. Oh-Park was responsible for the development of high-quality care models for inpatient and outpatient settings as well as system integration of clinical practice, research and education.

“I’m tremendously proud of Dr. Oh-Park for being named to this prestigious group,” Burke President and CEO Jeffrey Menkes said. “This recognition shows Dr. Oh-Park’s commitment to providing the highest level of rehabilitative care. She is a wonderful example for all of us at Burke to follow.”
